Has the service user been suffering from Mental Health problems

Severe 18 (17.14%) - number of service users claiming to be suffering from mental health problems such as psychosis, schizophrenia or severe depression

Moderate 36 (34.29%) – number of service users claiming to be suffering from moderate/mild mental health problems such as mild/moderate depression, moderate anxiety

No 51 (48.57%) – number of clients claiming not to have any mental health problems

Level of Risk

Low 43 (40.95%) – service users that are receiving certain level of support (accommodation/financial or other)

Moderate 34 (32.38%) - service users are receiving some support from friends/family/charity, but not continuously, destitution is having an obvious effect on their well being.

High 28 (26.67%) – vulnerable, rough sleepers, no support mechanism, poor health
